Just before the sun rose that first Easter morning the earth shook, the stone covering the entrance to the tomb rolled away and Jesus walked out of

the grave ALIVE! Death had been swallowed up in victory. Jesus had risen from the dead. It was no longer dark, dreary, depressing, with abandoned hope. It was now a day of victory and rejoicing and celebration rich with the new color of eternal life through Jesus Christ.

We received a message from God that day. It's a simple message, this Gospel, but yet it's the most important message in the entire world. Jesus died on the cross, He was buried, and He rose again. To receive that gift of salvation you have to accept that truth and make it personal.

This has been a difficult year for us as individuals and as a church family but one thing I truly hope we realize and that is, "God is in control even in the midst of the most difficult situations we could ever face." The question is simply this: "Do we trust Him in all things or do we live in fear?" Living in fear and worry will not lengthen your days upon this earth one second. We all have an appointed time to leave this earth, pandemic or not, and the fear that I have is that many are not prepared for that day and that I'm not doing enough to help them prepare.

God has given Ramoith Baptist Church the opportunity to reach out to this community and beyond to help those prepare for that appointed day. Will you pray in the days ahead to seek God's direction in the part you will play in this opportunity?

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The Empty Tomb

'Suddenly, the curtain of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom, the earth quaked, and the rocks were split. The tombs were also opened and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised. And they came out of the tombs after his resurrection, entered the holy city, and appeared to many. ' Matthew 27:51-53

The Curtain

As Jesus died on the cross, the curtain of the sanctuary was torn in two. For the first time since Exodus, man was allowed to have total access to God. A priest, a pastor, a minister was no longer needed to come to the Father. Jesus, in his death, had opened a door for all of us to come to God.

The Empty Tomb

But it was the empty tomb, the resurrection, that defeated death and allowed us to have our sins forever forgiven. It was the defeat of death that gave us the victory that we experience through Jesus the Christ.

Other Tombs

Notice that Matthew writes that other tombs were cracked open, and after Jesus' resurrection, many of the saints who had died, arose, and were seen by many.

I remember the first time I realized this had happened. I was at a

friends house on Easter, and we were watching an Easter story on TV. I couldn't believe what I was watching. I told my friend that that was not in the bible. Jesus alone was resurrected. No one else.

My friend grabbed his bible and we read Matthew 27. I couldn't believe it! I had read over that passage time-and-time again but I had never realized what I was reading. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead raised other saints from the dead as well. And they walked around the town and were seen by many. But they were not raised until Jesus was raised.

The Power!

The same power that raised Jesus from the dead, created the world. I imagine that creative power is still creating. It just goes on and on and on. Let there be..... and it never stops. Jesus was the first born of the dead. He was the first to be raised and forever live. We experience that same power when we believe. We are raised from the dead in the same way He was, and we too will live forever.

In John 11 we read the account of Lazarus. What if Jesus had said "Come out!" instead of "Lazarus, come out!" Would everyone have been raised from the dead? I dare not place limits on the power of Jesus. But Jesus was specific. He is specific with us as well. He calls us to Him. He doesn't make us come. He allows us to come, but we must come in faith, in belief, in surrender.

Look at the picture below. From the empty tomb we see the cross and the terrible price that was paid there. Our freedom from death has already been bought. The curtain is torn and access has been granted. The tomb has been cracked open. He calls, "Come out!" Will you come?

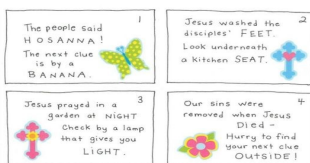
Make Easter about the Cross not the Candy!

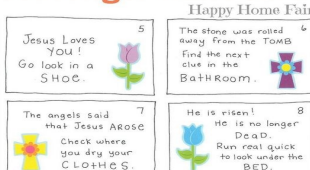
This Easter morning, I encourage you to take a minute and tell your kids why we celebrate Easter. We worship a risen Savior, who is worthy to be

1 Peter 2:24 says, “Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.” It is here that we find that the only way to truly be healed is in our belief of and through the work of Jesus Christ. Integritas Men's Bible Study & Prayer – Weekly synopsis on one of the 66 books of the Bible. Come gain a quick overview for how Christ is in every book of the Bible and how that book fits in the Bible. In each book of the Bible, Jesus shows up in Body, Shadow, Type or Prophecy. Have you read through His Love Story for you – the Bible?

March 2021 – We had a couple exciting Saturdays during March. One morning we had 17 men gathered in prayer and study. And, as we surveyed **Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, and Ezekiel** – we did it several times through the lens of Zoom. Yes, Winter and Covid have pushed us several times to pray and study through the technology of the Internet. And, while we aren't physically present in one place, Zoom has given us a means to come together for a common purpose – seeing Jesus work through prayer and seeing Jesus in every book of the Bible.

The book of Isaiah contains 66 chapters. **Isaiah** is considered by both Jews and Christians to be the greatest of the Prophets. Say, doesn't the Bible have 66 books? Why yes it does! And **Isaiah** even parallels the OT & NT in that there is a division of 39 and 27 chapters. Throughout **Isaiah**, you will find prophecies of Christ written 700 years before his coming. Prophecies include His virgin birth (*"Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call Him Immanuel."* **Isa 7:14**), His youth, His coming announced by a Prophet, His message, rejection, His death suffering for sin, His resurrection, AND, His coming Reign as King as the last chapters speak to the future when the coming Messiah will appear and set all things right. One of the favorite verses out of **Isaiah** that many hold onto is: *"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand"* **Isa 41:10**.

Jeremiah is the second longest book of the Bible. (Know

what the first is? - Psalms) So, while the job of a prophet is not sought, **Jeremiah** was obedient to God throughout his calling. Always doing God's bidding while seeing an unresponsive people. Jeremiah demonstrates a perseverance even when things appear futile. Also known as the weeping Prophet, **Jeremiah** stood strong to deliver God's message, but wept in private knowing captivity in Babylon was in the future for Judah. **Jeremiah** gave over 100 warnings not only to Judah, but 9 other nations as well. Jesus is evident in the later chapters as **Jeremiah** describes the coming covenant with His people of a promised Messiah. How do we discover God and Jesus? *"Call to Me, and I will answer you and will tell you great and mighty things, which you do not know."* Jer 33:3.

Lamentations is a continuation of the sorrow that Jeremiah feels as he watches the unfolding of the events he prophesied. Yet, Jeremiah sees the compassion that God has for the people of Israel as they are not totally wiped out. "Because of the Lord's love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Lam 3:22-23

Ezekiel is another call a decidedly sinful nation to repentance. Yet, **Ezekiel** is being used of God to call the nation of Israel back to Him not for the sake of punishment, but for one of restoration of obedience with blessings. *"I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you a heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh."* Ezk 36:26 And, so, with Jesus, we too can now have that new heart and new spirit. He's seeking you. Seek Him.

April 2021 – The study will start in **Daniel**, and then we'll move into the minor prophets – **Hosea, Joel, and Amos**. Join us to see how Jesus always shows up!

What Does “No Harm Shall Overcome You” in Psalm 91:10 Mean for the Coronavirus?

What a promise that is, the promise of no harm—but do we have the right interpretation when we read it? Does no harm mean that nothing bad should ever happen to me, including things like the coronavirus? As with many verses in the Bible, if we try to dissect it on its own, we can easily lose the bigger picture and true meaning. It's important to study Bible verses in proper context and that means we should:

Look at the full passage the verse is part of.

Look at the sections preceding and following the verse/ passage.

Look at the book as a whole that the verse is located in: who is the human author, what's the literary genre, what is the main theme and purpose, what was going on at that time in history, and who was the original audience?

Other great questions include: What does this passage tell me about man? And what does this passage tell me about God?

Additionally, we can access resources (articles, videos, books, audio, etc.) from sound theologians, pastors, and writers both past and present who put Scripture and the gospel first.

These elements provide important information for understanding the true meaning of a verse or Scripture passage. The Holy Spirit helps us to understand Scripture, but we need to use the tools that God has gifted us through literature, which is the medium He chose to use to record, keep, and spread His Word. Let us use the tools we have in prayer and with guidance from the Holy Spirit who lives in all believers.

What Does This Verse Mean for the Coronavirus?

Evil and harm cannot separate God's children from Him and that includes pandemics, like the coronavirus, natural disasters, and wicked people among other things. God's children are hidden with Him and their soul is safe with Him for all eternity. We are not guaranteed a pain-free or illness-free life, which is clear in Scripture from the Old Testament to the New Testament. We read in Scripture that it is often through strife and struggle that the believer grows spiritually with God and is an encouragement to others (Joseph, Jonah, Abraham, Moses, Esther, Paul, John, and so many others.).

Crosswalk.com Contributor, [Debbie McDaniel](#), shared, *“Sometimes, maybe unintentionally, in the busyness or difficulties of living, we might strive to survive on our own. We forget that what we need most, God's protection and the comfort of His presence, are freely available to those who love Him and walk under His covering. This entire chapter of Psalm 91 is filled with the goodness and power of God. Great reminders that He faithfully works on behalf of those who love Him.”*

Many of us are consumed right now by uncertainty and constantly changing news surrounding the coronavirus/ COVID-19. But we can't fear what may or may not happen to us, God asks us to trust Him through all situations and Paul tells us God's grace is sufficient, whether that grace leads to healing or homecoming. Our focus should not be on fear and uncertainty but the Refuge that our God is even in circumstances of disease and trouble. We are called to hope and trust in God no matter what is happening in our world. And He can be trusted during this pandemic, He is sovereign over the world and your individual life.

Avoiding illness is a fate no one can escape in this fallen world; what is important is that we know where our true home is and who our God is. [Psalm 91](#) is clear that for those whom God dwells with, their Refuge is God alone. The true home of the believer is with the Triune God—and God is with all believers every step of their earthly journey. And when that last step comes, Jesus is there to usher our life into glory, a life He paid for. Therefore, let us remember that in the storms and diseases God is with us, and in our joys let us give thanks to the Holy Spirit,

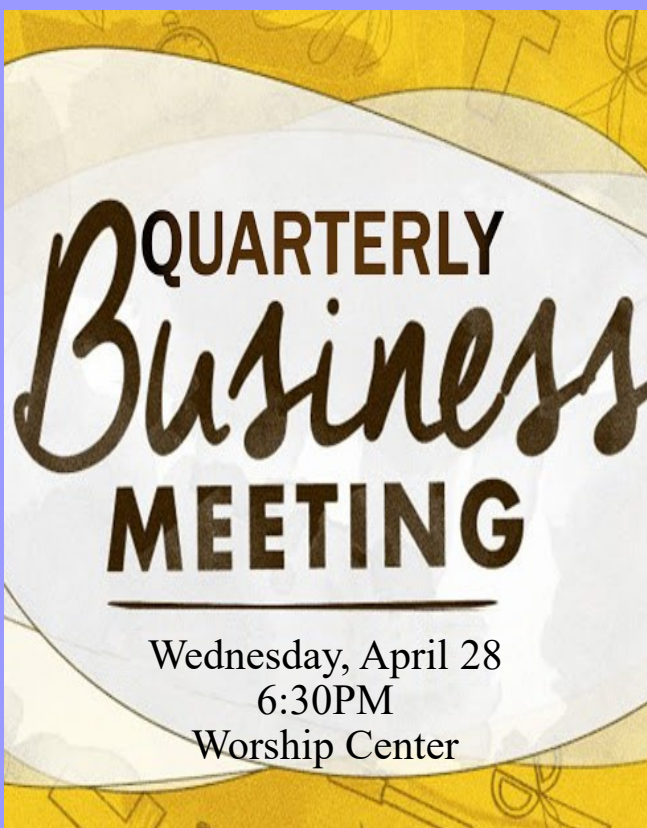
