Greetings Church Family,

All of the proposals presented by the Long Range Planning Committee were passed in our Called Business Meeting on September 16th. Some of these projects will start within the next week. The paving of our parking lot will begin on October 12th and, weather permitting, will conclude on October 22nd. We will not miss any services during this time and our safety team will be in the parking lot directing traffic as to where we can park each week. This project is much needed and will be a huge improvement to our church. The other projects will have no affect on any of our services or activities but will also be huge improvements to our facility both inside and outside.

We are now in the planning phases of our annual Fall Festival which is scheduled on October 31st from 3-6pm. This is a great outreach ministry for our church as we invite the community to join with us. As last year, we will also have a car show along with many other activities. We, the Constitution Revision Committee, are nearing the final draft of our church constitution and hopefully will be able to present it to you in the next 2-3 weeks. You will then have an additional 2 weeks to preview it before it will come before the church to be voted on. There will be some changes made to be in compliance with the incorporation of the church. There's really no major changes but some clarifications (and probably some confusion as it contains some legal language) and hopefully will answer some of the questions we've had in our current constitution.

If you have questions about anything that we haven't discussed in information to you please don't hesitate to ask me or one of the staff (and then they will come to me) or one of our deacons. We will do our best to answer any question you have. This has been a difficult time for us in keeping the church active and alive while many other churches and ministries remain on the sidelines. Continue to pray for the staff as we continue to bring all of our ministries back into play. We have deliberately started one ministry at a time to get them up and running before starting another ministry. We will continue to do this as long as it takes under the current conditions. back to where Penny was crying, took her hand, told her it was alright, and led her to the next area. <u>He perfectly illustrated what God does for us daily.</u> He takes our spiritual hand, tells us we will be ok through His peace, His word, or through another of His children, and then leads us to the next adventure.

His death and resurrection defeated the enemy and removes the stain of sin. In other words, he bridged the gap of this relational divide so we can once again relate with God.

Tip of the Month

Have you ever had something in your life that has caused an identity crisis? Something came into or left your life that had you wondering who you were? It is unsettling and difficult to go through. But have you ever viewed middle school and high school years of a teenager as one giant identity crisis? They're out there trying to figure out who they are and what they will become. Are they weird or

cool? Are they a winner or a loser? Valuable or a waste? As a parent, you know the answers. They are loved, priceless, champions you couldn't be prouder of made in the image of God. But how can you help communicate



this?

Tell more stories— Empathize with them by telling them stories of your awkward years. Let them know you do actually remember what it is like. "But they hate when I tell them stories," you might say. Here's a trick that may help.

Tell the hard stories – One of biggest fears of teens, the especially in the DC area, is failure. Be careful sharing stories of how you "did it better". A lot of you are very successful people, and we live in an area saturated with success culture. This sets an unspoken expectation of a bar that is set too high. Students need to hear the stories about failure of successful people like you to hear that it is not the end and no single failure defines you.

Normalize their experience-

Help them see that no matter how "weird" they see themselves, they are far from alone. By sharing the hard stories of our past, we can give teenagers hope that the future is bright. And as we direct them toward the path of God's will, we show them that is the way to overcome any difficulty and obstacle.

As we step into the Fall season, there will be a lot of things that we will see change right before our very eyes. We will see the days get shorter and cooler. The leaves on the trees will change colors and start to fall. We will find pumpkin spiced things and apple cider drinks galore. And while these are simple, passing changes there are other changes too.

Scientific studies have shown that as Fall comes around there are changes in people's disposition; they are tired more, more irritable, and more inclined to periods of isolation. Some assert that this is because of colder, less desirable weather. Others believe it to be associated to stress and concerns of hurried routines and holiday pressures. Whatever the case may be, these things can be taxing on a person's mental, physical, and spiritual well-being. The remedy for any and all of those issues won't be found in a seasonal drink, but only through the provisions that God provides. 1 Chronicles 16:11 says, "Seek the Lord and His strength; Seek His face evermore!" And why do you think that the Bible gives such an instruction? Because in other scriptures we are promised and told of how God will help us. Isaiah 41:10 tells us, "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Not only have we received a promise of help, but we have been commanded to rest on the assurance of God. Joshua 1:9 declares, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

These truths do not and never will change, God is for us and wants the best for us. But we must seek Him and the help He provides or else we are lost to folly. So, no matter what changes might come during this season of the year and no matter what reasons they might come, just trust in the Lord, our God to help you through it all. His word is filled with His promises...and that is a provision that you can always rely upon.




