

Who is your standard?

When we speak or write, we send a message telling others who we are. We are telling them what we believe. We are telling them how we will behave.

When others read our words, they get a snapshot of us. That picture can be flattering, or it can be embarrassing. We must think carefully about what we write and what we say. We all have had moments when we wish we had stopped the words from coming out of our mouths or the words from hitting the page. Maybe those words have followed us to job interviews. Maybe those words been returned to us by our children. Maybe we have

been sanctified over the years and our image has changed but most are still looking at that old picture. It is not who we are today. Maybe we are being compared to others and what they say, write or do.

Paul had this problem in 2 Corinthians 10:10, For it is said, "His letters are weighty and powerful, but his physical presence is weak and his public speaking amounts to nothing." The people at Corinth were saying that Paul was one thing when he was absent but

was different when he was present with them. Those who were criticizing compared Paul to others. They expected Paul to be a bigger-than-life figure. He was not. Paul was not imposing or well spoken. This is the type of person God often uses. Paul responded with the simple fact that he was called by Christ and he would use that authority if needed, but he had no desire to compare himself to others. His standard was Christ. So, who is our standard?

Do we compare ourselves to the idols of this world? Do we want to look like, act like, and be like the movie stars or superstars of our culture? I look back to the 70's and think to myself, "What was I thinking?" I look at pictures of popular musicians of the 70's and I think, "What were they thinking?" Not only do our idols often have substandard morals but the thing we emulate is often passing. Their appearance (big hair, big mustaches, big shirt collars, big belts) thankfully fall out of fashion. They don't stand the test of time.

Why not? Things change. We change. Our ideas and morals change. What is accepted and not accepted changes. Ask any politician and they will say things have changed and they cannot be held to a standard from 20, 30,40 or 50 years ago. But there is one who never changes.


God is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. He is perfect and perfection cannot change. If a perfect something changes, it is no longer perfect. So, God never changes. He is our standard. He was Paul's standard. He should be our standard.

This is not easy. Others want us all to walk lockstep with them. They don't want us to live differently and call attention to their imperfections. They react to a different life with persecution. They leave us out of the group. They call us names. They make fun of our lifestyle. They call us hypocritical. They call us evil

and hateful for having a different standard. But that is nothing new. Jesus experienced these things. His followers have always experienced these things and much worse. They have been tortured, locked up, crucified, beheaded, burned alive, drowned, stoned, shot, bombed, and many more horrible deaths. What did Paul say in Acts 5:41? "Then they went out from the presence of the Sanhedrin, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to be treated shamefully on behalf of the Name." It was an honor to suffer for Christ.

Paul was who he said he was. Paul is trusted because he lived up to the words he wrote. He backed up his words with action and when things were tough, he believed in the promise and gave his life for his faith. Oh, that we were as faithful! Oh, that Christ will be our standard and what we say and write will be reflected in how we live!


